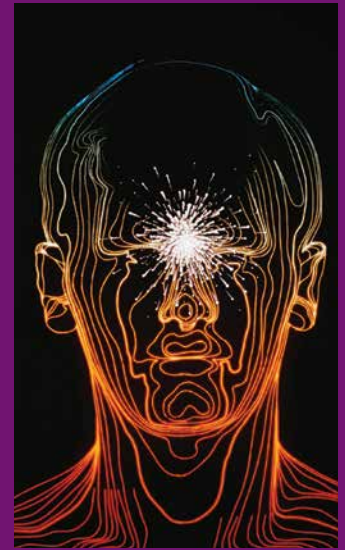

About the Conference

Acromegaly is the second most common syndrome due to excess secretion of a pituitary hormone – growth hormone. Untreated, acromegaly is miserable for patients, causing discomfort and pain, and increased risk of diabetes, heart disease, respiratory disease (including sleep apnea), severe arthritis, and premature death. A major problem is delay in diagnosis, largely because the physical features and manifestations develop so slowly. However, once the condition is diagnosed the range of treatments available today should mean a bright future for all but a few patients, with restoration of normal life expectancy in most.

This symposium affords an opportunity for all who play a role in the care of patients with acromegaly to learn from **an internationally recognized faculty – including three former Presidents of the Pituitary Society**. The focus will be on diagnosis, state of the art surgical and medical management, radiation treatment, special medical situations, and difficult cases.

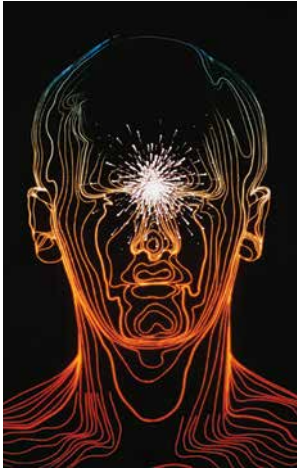
